Welcome to CyberMyth

'A beggar sits, hungry, outside the walls of a Radiant castle, pleading for alms. The castle bears the name Soul. The beggar does not know It belongs to him, nor that every chamber within awaits his return'

CyberMyth, a visual and symbolic journey that interrogates our time through the lenses of myth, technology, and inner transformation.

Ten works — five prints by Caterina Marotta and five paintings by Francesco Filippelli — unfold as archetypal mirrors, thresholds to be crossed by those seeking deeper meaning.

Francesco Filippelli, with his patented technique known as the **Alchemical Temporama**, turns painting into ritual. His canvases evolve over time, chemically reacting, as if each work were a living organism — a soul in metamorphosis. Here, matter becomes process, and process becomes metaphor for being.

Caterina Marotta — Myth as Critique of the Present

Caterina Marotta's five graphic prints are allegorical visions that decode the present through the Timeless language of myth:

King Midas: Greed that turns everything into gold, yet starves the world of nourishment. Appearance triumphs, but reality withers. Power devours what it touches.

Narcissus: No longer enchanted by beauty, he drowns in the reflection of his own death. The inflated self, mirrored in digital solitude, dissolves in the absence of connection.

Pandora: Her box unleashes not hope, but a domineering technology. The act of opening becomes an act of hubris — a loss of freedom disguised as progress.

Atlante: The machine bears the weight of the world, but is also its prisoner. Our creation sustains us, overwhelms us, and ultimately defines us.

Prometheus: No longer a bringer of fire, he sculpts idols of death. Knowledge without ethics breeds destruction, not salvation.

Francesco Filippelli — Odyssey as Soul Journey

Filippelli's five paintings are stages of an initiatory path, where Homer's Odyssey becomes a metaphor for the inner voyage:

Homer: The poet of creation, celebrating the joy of artistic genesis. The word is origin, joy, and cosmos.

Penelope: Waiting as radical faith. The longer Odysseus elays, the more certain she becomes. Hope is not passive — it is a force that shapes time.

The Trojan Horse: From deception to winged steed.

Body, soul, and spirit unite to break down inner walls — prejudices and fixed ideas that bar access to the true self.

Calypso: Obstacle and revelation. From seductress to monster, from monster to divinity. The recognized limit becomes a threshold, and the threshold becomes the way home.

Odysseus as Beggar: The king becomes a pauper, the ego dissolves. As in Teresa of Ávila's Interior Castle, the beggar at the gate is the true sovereign — the one who has traversed every chamber of the soul.

Cybermyth is not merely an exhibition:

it is an invitation to see beyond the veil, to recognize the myths that inhabit us, and to transmute them. A philosophical journey, a visual rite, a threshold to cross — to return home, within.

Francesco Filippelli

Painter & Chemist — Born in Naples (1993), of Calabrian origins Based in Naples | temporamaalchemico.com Francesco Filippelli is an Italian painter and chemist. He began painting at 14 under Francesca Strino and soon developed a deep fascination with the nature of perception and matter. At 18, he enrolled in the Faculty of Chemistry at the University of Naples "Federico II" to explore the physical essence of reality.

Since 2010, he has exhibited across Italy in numerous group and solo shows, with works featured in contemporary art magazines and catalogs curated by Prof. Vittorio Sgarbi.

In 2020, inspired by a visit to the Sansevero Chapel and the portrait of Prince Raimondo di Sangro, he began developing his original "Temporama Alchemico" technique — a synthesis of painting and alchemical transformation — completed in 2023 with his first cycle of transformation portraits. Since then, the technique has received numerous official recognitions for its originality and artistic innovation.

His interests include quantum physics, maritime art, and tobacco culture.




